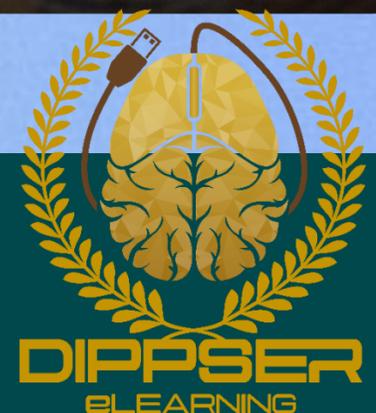

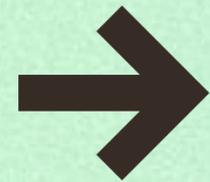
What is Email Marketing?

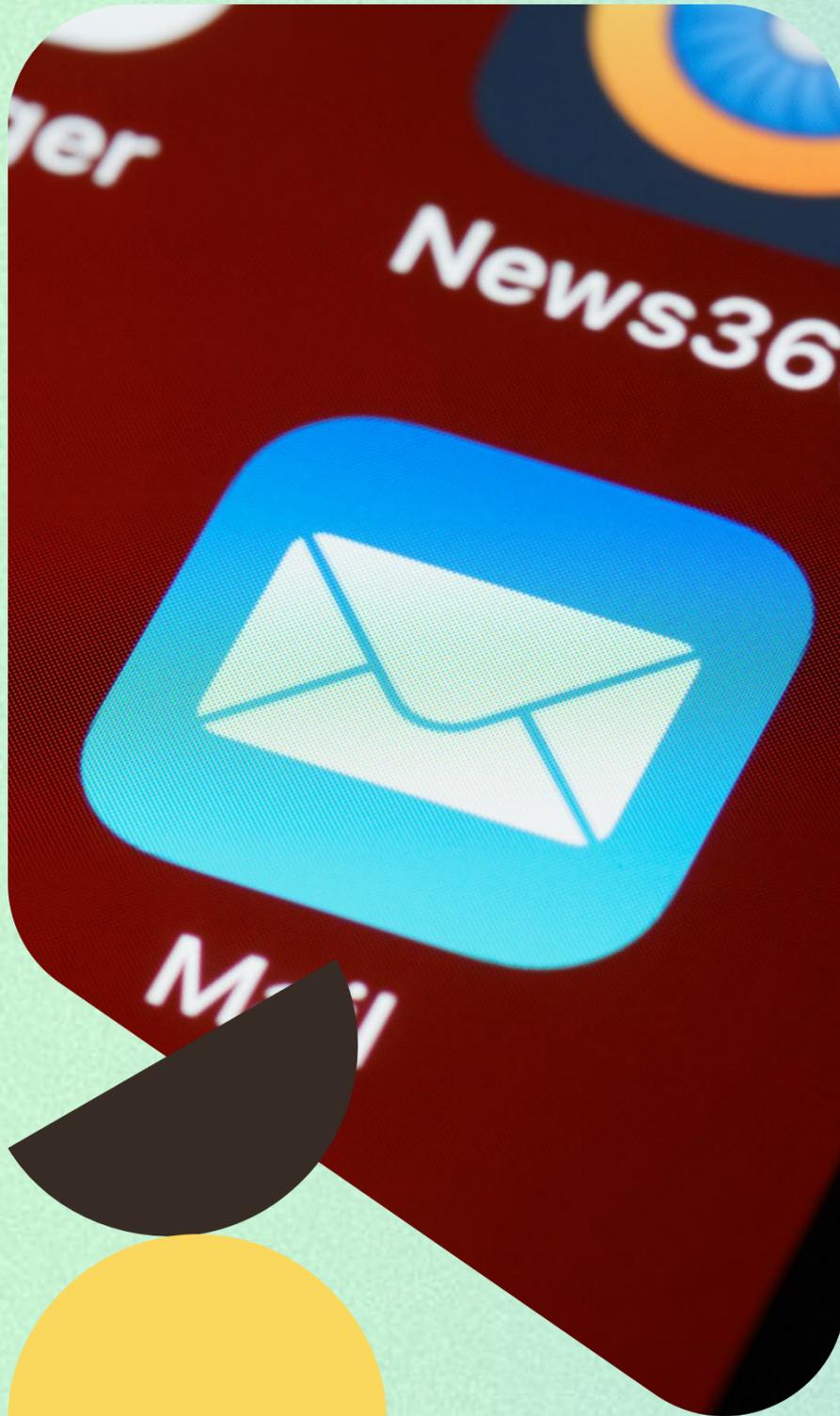

Challenges to Consider

Key Drawbacks of Email Marketing Strategies

One significant drawback is the **risk of spam filters**. Emails can easily end up in the spam folder, reducing visibility. Additionally, maintaining a **quality mailing list** requires ongoing effort to ensure high engagement rates.



Things to Avoid in Email Marketing

Content & Message

- Misleading subject lines
 - Don't bait-and-switch. Your subject line must reflect the content.
- All-caps or excessive punctuation
 - Example: "BUY NOW!!!!!" comes off as spammy.
- Too much sales hype
 - Overly promotional language triggers spam filters.
- Walls of text
 - Make content scannable; nobody likes reading huge blocks of text.
- Neglecting personalization
 - "Dear Customer" feels generic and cold.
- Overloading with images
 - Too many images (or image-only emails) get blocked or flagged.
- Broken links
 - Always test your links before sending.
- No clear call-to-action
 - Readers should know exactly what to do next.



Things to Avoid in Email Marketing

Legal & Compliance

- Ignoring consent
 - Never email people who haven't opted in.
- No unsubscribe option
 - This is required by laws like CAN-SPAM and GDPR.
- Hiding your business information
 - Always include your valid physical address.
- Failing to honor unsubscribes promptly
 - Unsubscribed users must be removed within a reasonable time.
- Buying email lists
 - These often violate privacy laws and damage sender reputation.



Things to Avoid in Email Marketing

Technical & Deliverability

- Skipping authentication
 - Always set up SPF, DKIM, and DMARC records.
- No plain-text version
 - HTML-only emails can get filtered or flagged.
- Large file attachments
 - These clog inboxes and increase spam risk.
- Ignoring mobile optimization
 - Most emails are opened on mobile—design accordingly.
- Sending too frequently
 - Over-emailing burns out your list and drives unsubscribes.



Things to Avoid in Email Marketing

Strategy & Etiquette

- Not segmenting your list
 - One-size-fits-all blasts reduce relevance.
- Failing to test
 - Always preview and test on multiple devices.
- Ignoring engagement metrics
 - Low opens/clicks signal something's wrong.
- No clear goal for each email
 - Don't email "just to email."



Key Milestones in Email Marketing

First Email

The birth of email marketing in the 1970s

The first email was sent, marking the **beginning of digital communication**.

Spam Emergence

The rise of unsolicited emails in the 1990s

Marketers began leveraging email, leading to the **challenge of spam regulations**.

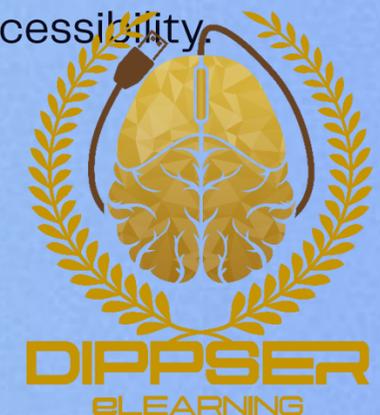

Common Reasons Gmail Temporarily Blocks Sending

1. Sending Limits Exceeded

- Personal Gmail accounts:
 - Max ~500 emails per day.
- Google Workspace accounts:
 - Max ~2,000 emails per day
- Exceeded recipients per email:
 - Max ~500 recipients per message.
- Too many emails sent in a short time:
 - Sudden bursts look suspicious (e.g., blasting hundreds of emails in 10 minutes).

What happens?

Once you hit these limits, Gmail locks sending for 24 hours. After that, sending is automatically restored.



Common Reasons Gmail Temporarily Blocks Sending

2. Spam-like Activity Detected

- Your emails triggered spam filters (too many bounced emails, spam reports, or suspicious content).

Examples:

- Lots of identical emails.
- Lots of links or attachments.
- High volume to unverified addresses.



Common Reasons Gmail Temporarily Blocks Sending

3. Account Security Concerns

- Google detected unusual login patterns or thinks your account may be compromised.

Signs:

- Login from unfamiliar locations or devices.
- Sudden massive sending.

What happens?

To protect your account, sending is paused while Google reviews or asks you to verify ownership.



Common Reasons Gmail Temporarily Blocks Sending

4. Using Gmail as a Bulk Email Platform

- Gmail is not designed for marketing blasts.
- Using it like an email marketing service (Mailchimp, SendGrid) often results in limits and temporary blocks.



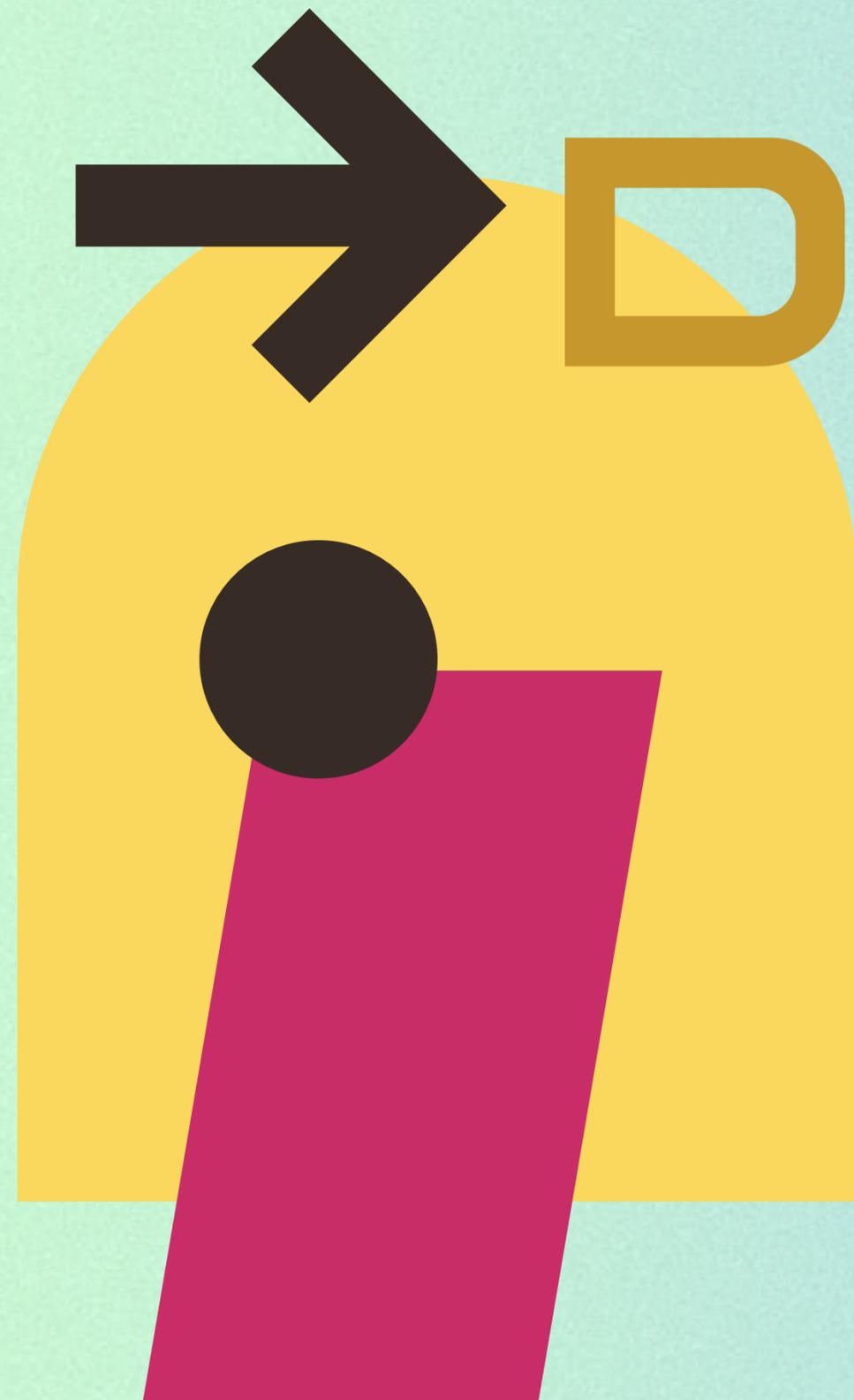


How to Avoid This in the Future

Here are some tips to stay within Google's good graces:

- ✓ Respect sending limits
 - Stay below daily and hourly thresholds.
- ✓ Use professional email marketing tools
 - Mailchimp, Brevo, ConvertKit, etc., are built for bulk emails.
- ✓ Warm up new accounts
 - Gradually increase sending volume over time.
- ✓ Maintain good list hygiene
 - Avoid invalid emails.
 - Remove inactive or bouncing addresses.
- ✓ Avoid spammy content
 - No misleading subject lines, excessive links, or attachments.
- ✓ Secure your account
 - Use 2-Step Verification.
 - Monitor logins.
- ✓ Don't send the same email to huge lists in one go
 - Break it into smaller batches.
